## Hybrid Ministry Task Force: Workshop Breakout Session

## Introduction:

- 1 in 5 not attending online; 60% want to return to in-person after covid but up to 40% would be happy to remain online
- Hybrid Ministry: DNA; our DNA hasn't changed, our purpose hasn't changed
  - o D: define hybrid ministry according to purpose, not what-you've-always-done
  - o N: identify needs to make effective ministry possible
  - A: apply methods that enable the participants to circle back and discuss based on their experiences
- Barna research during covid; gave recommendations:
  - Hire an online pastor
  - o Push new media beyond Sunday
  - Audit services
  - Seek out the missing
  - Close the loop with discussion

## Questions of the Task Force:

- 1. The Very Rev. David Trautman, Trinity Thomasville, GA: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches regarding how to build community with your broader community during covid?
  - Connect with your local business community; call them, visit them, build relationships with them; ask them how you can be praying over them; add them to the Prayers of the People
  - O David's church does a Theology on Tap at a local brewery for seekers; during the pandemic the brewery worked with them to continue to offer it
- 2. Dr. Sarah Lebhar Hall, Incarnation Tallahassee: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches regarding equipping families to disciple in the home?
  - Do whatever you can to get families reading Scripture together every day; "Anything worth doing is worth doing badly," by GK Chesterton; keep the bar low at first, just be in the Word every day
  - o Read for 2 minutes; what did you notice?
- 3. Ben Cheney, ChristChurch Montgomery: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches regarding their technology while building online communities?
  - Identify the purpose of the hybrid program; without knowing the purpose, you'll
    exhaust resources and volunteers; is this a front door or is it in-reach for adult
    education, or is it outreach, or is it for shut ins? Identifying the purpose will help to
    identify approach
  - o Include short videos to explain about the church so they can 'visit'
  - Get good technology equipment
  - o Golden rule: people will watch decent quality with good sound way longer than they will watch high quality video with low quality sound: put money into sound
- 4. Debra Gordon, Christ Church Vero: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches regarding communication in a hybrid ministry environment?
  - o Hospitality is a major part of hybrid ministry, as is authenticity
  - o Be aware that some viewing and engaging will not have updated technology
  - o Make sure you have all materials available and posted in the online space
  - O Your front door in an online community should be a chat or a direct message

- o Don't be afraid of vulnerability and mistakes online
- 5. Wendell Kimbrough, Apostles Eastern Shore, Fairhope, AL: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches regarding their musical worship in an online community?
  - o Music streaming into your iPad is less forgiving than a sanctuary space
  - Keep music streamed to online very simple; fewer singers and instruments will sound better online
  - o Put your chord charts in the chat window and invite people to play along
- 6. Angela Jones, Trinity Thomasville, GA: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches regarding how to minister to families during covid?
  - Consider ministry of presence
  - o Individual contact with families: video greetings, requests for prayer, etc.
  - Storytime outside
- 7. Rev. Morgan Clark, ChristChurch Montgomery: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to churches for pastorally caring for parishioners not able to return to the building right away?
  - O Direct phone calls; divide households up and keep same 'assignment' to a team member for continuity
  - o Be intentional in seeking the missing
- 8. Rev. Robert Seawell, Apostles Eastern Shore, Fairhope, AL: What is one practical suggestion you'd offer to Rectors who are trying to build online communities?
  - o Don't allow your team to burn out; hire someone to help the staff
  - Have grace
